Background Vindictive

When he was younger, Julius was kidnapped by pirates and held for ransom. The whole time he was in captivity he vowed to the pirates that when he was freed he would crucify them all. Ambitious

After he had marched on Rome and then defeated Pompey and his allies at Pharsalus, Caesar had himself named as dictator for life. This basically granted the unlimited powers of dictator that were to be available for a short time, for his whole life.

Once during a procession when Caesar passed by the tribune Pontius Aquilia refused to stand for him. He then yelled at Aquilia saying, "Come then Aquilia, take back the republic from me!" And for some days afterward, Caesar would not make a promise without saying, "That is, if Pontius Aquilia will allow me." From this we can see his ambition and breaking convention.

Arrogant, Egotistic

So here we can see that he was arrogant, entitled and egotistic. So to compile them all together his worst qualities were is callousness/ruthlessness, arrogance, adultery, ambition and breaking the rules and vindictiveness. Caesar was a complex man which is something to keep in mind. So, these characteristics don't tell the whole story of who he is. Just the bad side.
