ALTAR TO THE UNKNOWN GOD

Acts 17:16-34

Acts 17 includes a speech that Paul is said to have given at the <u>Areopagus</u>, which was the name of a hill and a council. In it he seeks to move his listeners from idolatry to faith in the true God.

Context: Followers of Greek traditions often built shrines to show gratitude for help from a god or goddess. The altar to "an unknown god" (Acts 17:23; cf. Pausanias 5.14.8) was apparently intended to give thanks for divine aid by a a person who had received help, but did not know which god to thank. Paul's speech directs attention to the true God, the Creator of all things, who does not live in shrines made with hands.




(Shown here is an altar to an unnamed deity that was found in Rome.)





Martyred for Christ Sake *Paul's Friends - Romans 16, Col. 4*

Paul – beheaded by Nero outside the city of Rome 64-66 AD **Timothy** – beaten dragged through streets, stoned to death **Philemon** – Buried up to waist then stoned his with wife. **Apphia** – wife of Philemon, killed by Ruler Artocles **Archippus** – son of Philemon, slashed with knives **Epaphras** – Colossians 1:7, 4:12-13 fellow prisoner, pastor **Aristarchus** – Acts 19:29, 20:4, 27:2, Col. 4:10 beheaded Rome **Mark** – rope around neck dragged through streets 68 AD **Luke** – died in Rome before Nero, beheaded
